The Certificate Course in Russian is a Two Semesters or one-year part-time course with the examination conducted at the end of semesters.

 - b. Speaking: To engage in simple dialogues.
 - c. Reading: To be able to read and understand elementary texts.
 - d. Writing: To write a few simple sentences and short paragraphs.
- Introducing the learners to the written system of Russian language. II.
- Giving the learners the mastery of and the ability to manipulate the basic III. grammatical structures and the most essential vocabulary items.
- Exposing the learners to relevant aspects of the life and culture of Russia. IV.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY: 10+2 or equivalent qualification with a minimum of 50 % marks.
